And DX's service to VAO doesn't stop there! DX also couriers spectacles free of charge between their headquarters in Sussex and various prisons throughout the UK so that the glasses can be sorted and graded. DX's support allows VAO to continue its recycling scheme and provide spectacles for its projects in the developing world.

How to get spectacles to Vision Aid Overseas via DX

Please follow these simple instructions to get your spectacles delivered to Vision Aid Overseas free of charge:

- 1.** Please remember that Vision Aid Overseas cannot use spectacle cases in its work because they are too heavy to transport so could you please remove these to make room for more spectacles.
- 2.** Pack the boxes in a sturdy box – so they are safe to travel. Please put a compliment slip inside the box so we know who's sent them!
- 3.** Mark the box clearly with the following:

RH10 9FZ**

- 4.** Pass the box to your DX delivery driver and ask him to deliver it to Vision Aid Overseas.
